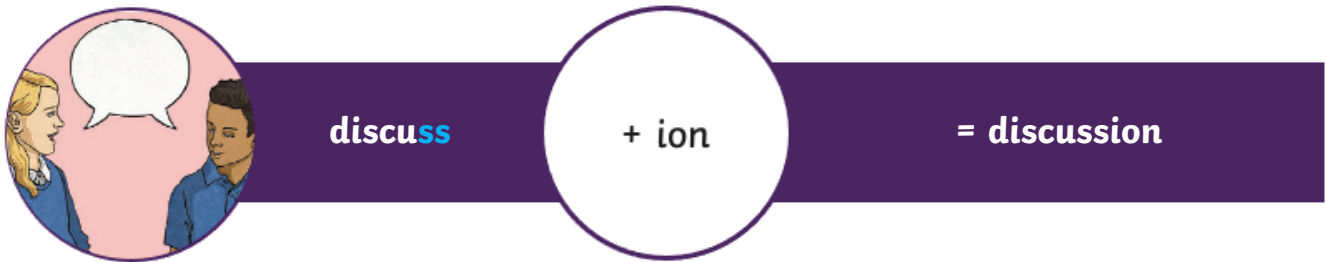


**Monday:** Read the information below to learn about this week's spelling rule.

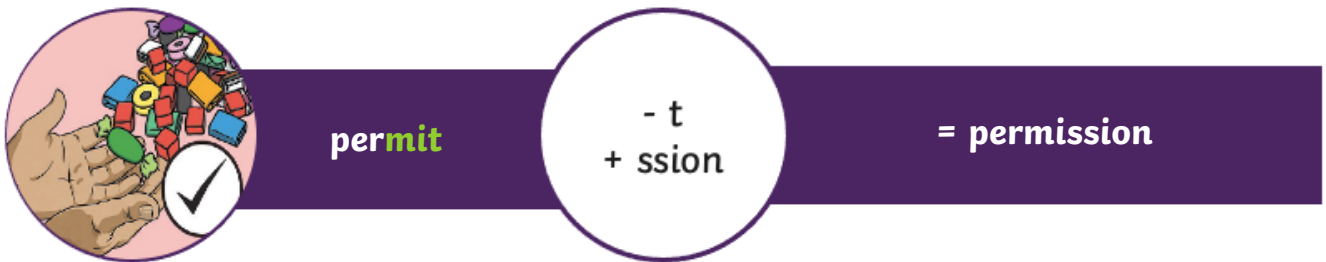
This week we are continuing to look at words which end with the sound /shun/ spelt 'sion'.

All of the words that end in 'sion' are nouns – a naming word (person, place or thing)

This week our root words end in either **ss** or **mit**. The rules for changing our root words with these endings to nouns are a bit more tricky. Take a look at the explanations below.



If the root word ends with **ss**, keep the **ss** and just add '**ion**'.  
Make sure you don't have three s-es!



If the root word ends with **mit**, remove the **t** and add '**ssion**'.  
This time the suffix has two s-es!

**Now you have learnt the rules, have a go at turning these root words into this week's spelling words by adding the correct ending.**

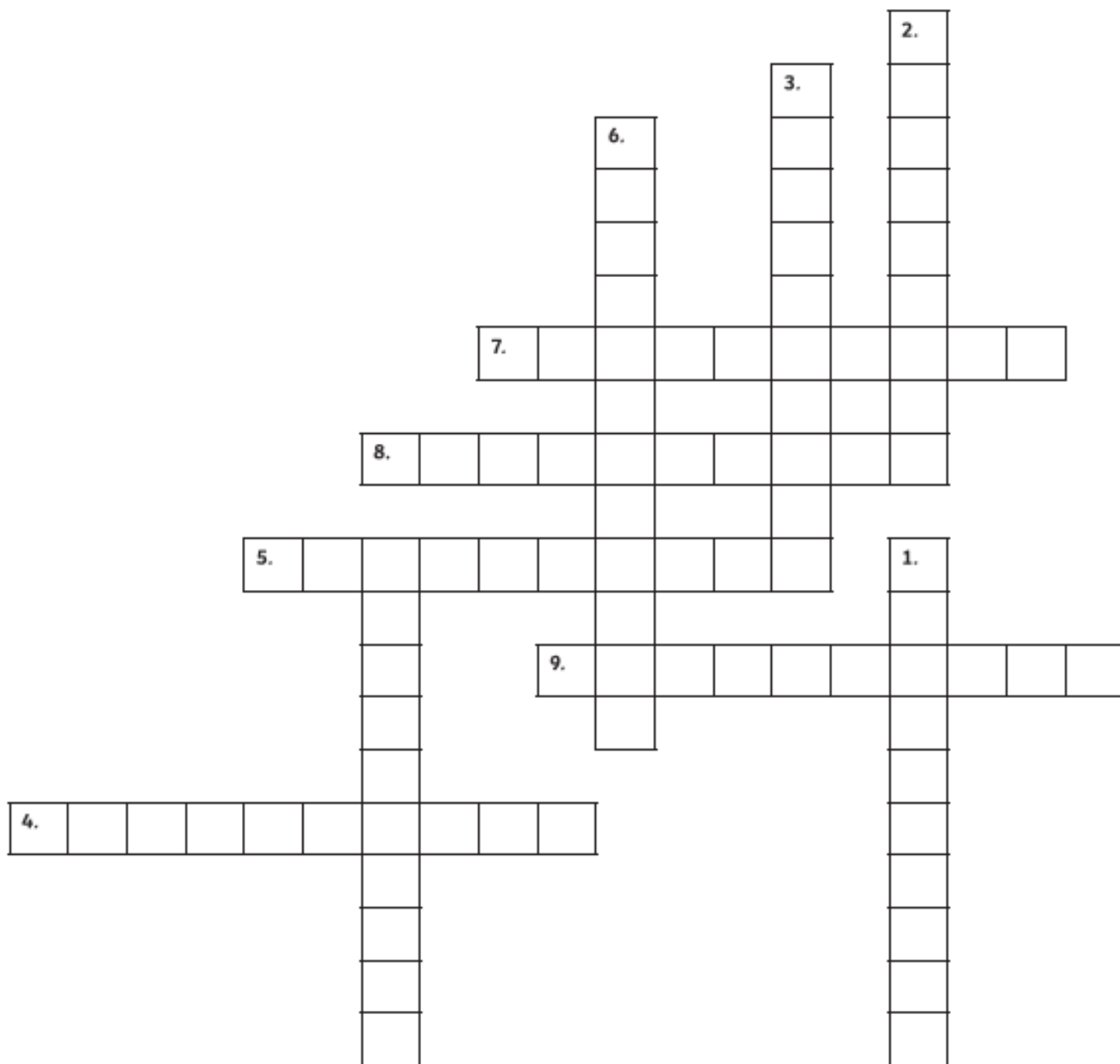
