#### In Literacy we are...


- Listening to and retelling favourite stories and rhymes

- Counting reliably up to 20 and saying the number that is one more or one less
- Estimating and checking by counting
- Solving simple addition and subtraction problems
- Ordering and sequencing familiar events
- Using everyday language related to time and money

In **Understanding of the World** we are...

- Talking confidently about past and present events
- Looking at the different types of transport
- Using the computer and other types of technology confidently
- Celebrating different festivals
- Learning about the people who help us

- Singing our favourite songs
- Exploring colour

## Autumn Term 2

#### Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Play games to teach your child about taking-turns
- Encourage your child to describe how they are feeling (other than sad or happy), likes and dislikes
- Talk to your child about behaviour and consequences

#### **Communication and Language**

- Sing nursery rhymes together
- Read stories to your child
- Play a game of hide and seek with a toy to encourage your child to use prepositions (under, on top, in)
- Encourage your child to ask questions
- Research the topic and talk about what you find out
- Talk to your child about everything they see and do!

#### **Physical Development**

- Take your child to the park to allow them the freedom to run and climb on apparatus confidently
- Kick and catch a large ball and play other ball games
- Use equipment and tools, such as scissors, paint brushes and pencils effectively
- Making and playing with play dough
- Encourage your child to dress and undress independently

#### Literacy

- Encourage your child to tell you a favourite story
- Sing a favourite song or nursery rhyme together
- Explore rhyming words
- When you have read to your child, talk about the characters and what happens in the story
- Visit the library
  - Encourage your child to write their name, shopping lists and messages to people

Ways you can help at home: Foundation

Stage Two

#### Mathematics

- Sing number rhymes
- Play board games such as snakes and ladders to practice counting
- Count objects toys, trees, cutlery cars...anything!
- Look at the calendar and talk about the date
- Look at house numbers
- Talk about prices when you are out shopping
- Cook with your child and talk about what you need and how much
- Talk about the size of objects, compare them which is bigger/smaller, taller/shorter, heavier/lighter
- Use positional language when describing where things are, it's on the chair, under the table, next to the chair, behind the chair
